Ideas and suggestions for IMMEDIATE ACTIONS

- * Doing away with the colour grey by introducing **warm, welcoming colours**
- * Introducing **green areas** both inside and outside the hospital
- * Improving the internal pathways and adopting **clear and legible signs** in order to reduce the degree of disorientation
- * Making people's **stay** more **comfortable** and facilitate their **privacy**
- * Adopting differentiated interior **decorations**, each suited to the various **therapeutical spaces**

Psychological Stress Impairs Early Wound Repair Following Surgery

Objective: Laboratory studies have demonstrated that psychological stress is associated with slower healing of small superficial wounds. The application of this finding to the clinical environment has not yet been undertaken. In order to do this, we investigated the relationship between psychological stress and wound repair in patients following routine surgery. Methods: Forty women who had undergone open inguinal repair. Wound fluid was collected from 12 participants over the first 10 days postoperative period. Wound healing was assessed by levels of malondialdehyde, hydrocortisone, and matrix metalloproteinase-9 in the fluid. Other measures were recorded.

View Through a Window May Influence Recovery from Surgery

Abstract. Records on recovery after cholecystectomy of patients in a suburban Pennsylvania hospital between 1972 and 1981 were examined to determine whether assignment to a room with a window view of a natural setting might have restoration influences. Twenty-three surgical patients assigned to rooms with windows looking out onto a natural setting recovered faster than those assigned to rooms with windows looking out onto a city street.

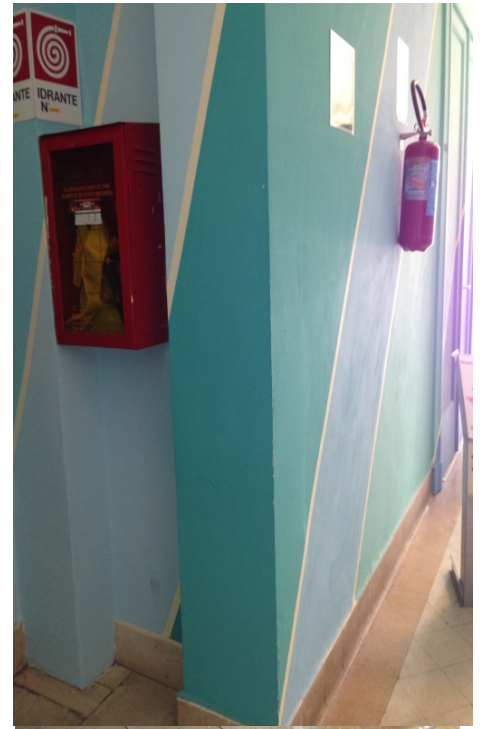












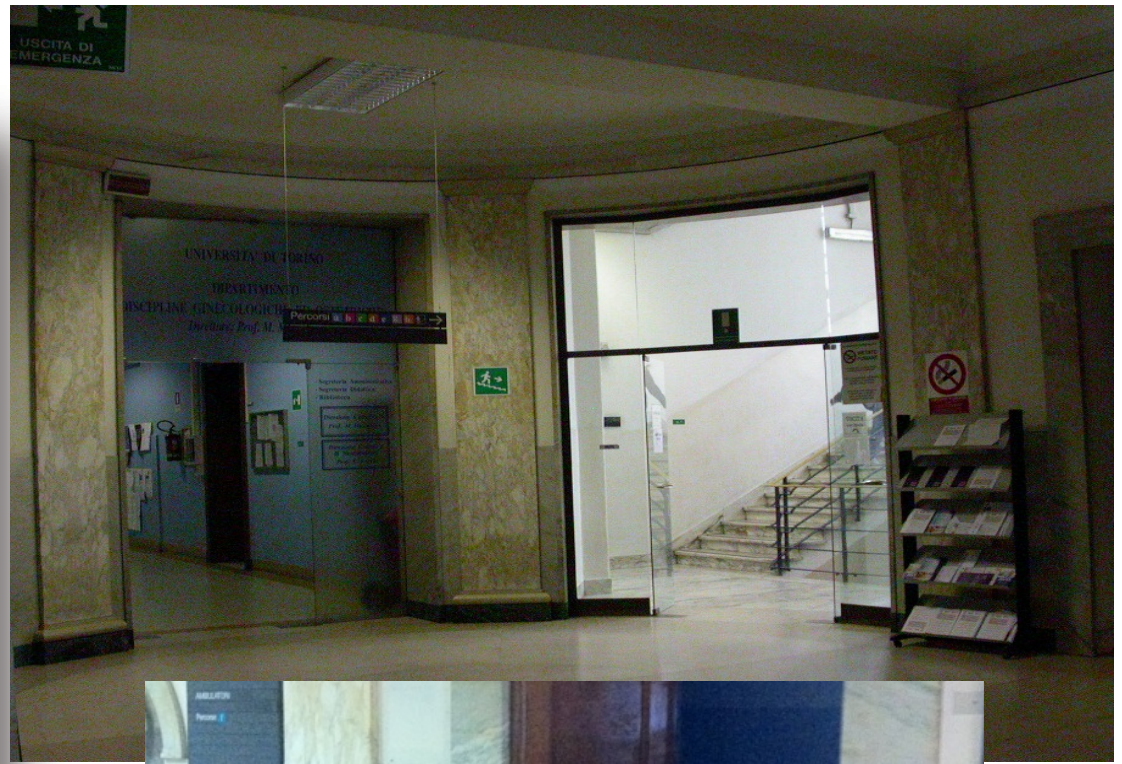

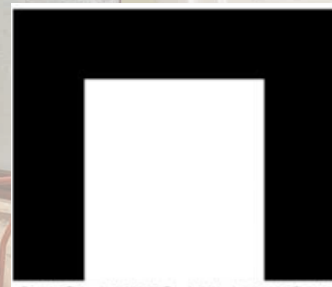
